Rally Turkey: ŠKODA driver Jan Kopecký leads, teammate Pontus Tidemand had to retire

- › ŠKODA works crew Jan Kopecký/Pavel Dresler on top of WRC 2 category after day two of Rally Turkey Marmaris, 10th round of the FIA World Rally Championship
- › Teammates Pontus Tidemand/Jonas Andersson suffered punctures and had to retire on the second day's last stage with broken suspension
- › With ŠKODA privateers Chris Ingram/Ross Whittock in second position, the Czech brand enjoys double lead in WRC 2 category
- › ŠKODA Motorsport boss Michal Hrabánek: "Jan kept the lead despite suffering punctures. I feel sorry for Pontus, who had to retire."

Marmaris, 14 September 2018 – ŠKODA works crews were initially dominating the WRC 2 category of the 10th round of the FIA World Rally Championship 2018, the Rally Turkey Marmaris (13–16/09/2018). While Jan Kopecký/Pavel Dresler (CZE/CZE) are still leading at the end of day two despite collecting two punctures on their ŠKODA FABIA R5, teammates Pontus Tidemand/Jonas Andersson (SWE/SWE) had to retire on Friday's last stage. After three punctures the reigning WRC 2 Champions ran out of spare wheels, finally the suspension broke. With ŠKODA privateers Chris Ingram/Ross Whittock in second position, the Czech brand still holds a double lead in WRC 2 category.

Right from the start, the battle for victory in WRC 2 category at Rally Turkey Marmaris was really intense. On the opening show stage on Thursday evening in the streets of Marmaris, ten thousand rally fans saw ŠKODA factory driver Jan Kopecký set the second quickest time just 1.4 seconds ahead of teammate Pontus Tidemand. But the real rally started on Friday morning with the 38.10 kilometres "Cetibili" test, the longest stage of the event. All kind of gravel surfaces, fast passages and narrow winding roads were waiting for the crews. "It was quite tricky, especially because there was no wind at all. In some places, I was completely lost in the dust. No big push, as this rally is really long." Having said that, Jan Kopecký was just a blink of an eye, exactly 0.7 seconds, quicker than Pontus Tidemand, who commented: "I was very careful in the beginning. The next stage should be cleaner, so I will push on that one."

After two stages, the gap between WRC 2 category leader Jan Kopecký and second placed Pontus Tidemand stood at just 2.1 seconds. On the next stage the Czech Rally Champion set another fastest time and increased his lead to nine seconds. One stage further, Pontus Tidemand fought back and with his first fastest time reduced the gap to five seconds before the midday service rest halt in Marmaris. The afternoon featured the repetition of the morning stages which were even rougher now after the complete field had left ruts on the gravel roads and massive stones had been dug out by the cars. As a precaution Tidemand changed the setup of his ŠKODA FABIA R5 for the remaining three stages of the day.

Nevertheless, already the repetition of the 38 kilometres of "Cetibili" saw both ŠKODA crews in trouble. While Tidemand had to change one puncture on the stage, Kopecký suffered two flat front tires which he had to change. Tidemand discovered at the end of the stage that he had an additional slow puncture which as well he had to change. As a consequence, both ŠKODA works drivers had to drive the two remaining stages of the day with no spare tires, because another

puncture would lead to retirement. "Anything can happen any moment to anyone", was Jan Kopecký's comment after the massive mishap. Although both crews lost a lot of time, Tidemand kept the second place in the WRC 2 category standings, followed by teammate Kopecký by just 17.3 seconds while other competitors suffered from punctures as well. On the last stage of the day, reigning WRC 2 Champion Tidemand collected another slow puncture and with no spare wheel left and on top of that with a broken suspension, he had to retire from third place. Jan Kopecký, knowing that another puncture could stop his race as well, drove sensitively for the remaining kilometres of the day and reached the finish of the tough Friday leg holding the WRC 2 category lead.

ŠKODA Motorsport boss Michal Hrabánek commented: "What a tough day! Jan kept the category lead despite suffering punctures. I feel sorry for Pontus, who had to retire."

Saturday (15 September) will feature six more stages over 134.20 kilometres. After overall 17 tests totalling 317.25 kilometres, the winner will reach the podium in Marmaris on Sunday (16 September) at around 13h00.

ŠKODA Motorsport Overview

ŠKODA has been successful on the motorsport scene since 1901. Be it on the circuit or in rallies, ŠKODA has celebrated victories and won titles all around the world. Historical highlights include winning the title in the FIA World Rally Championship (WRC 2) for the first time in 2016, numerous title wins in the FIA European Rally Championship (ERC), the FIA Asia-Pacific Rally Championship (APRC) and the Intercontinental Rally Challenge (IRC), as well as the victory in the European Touring Car Championship in 1981. ŠKODA teams have also triumphed in the world's oldest and most famous rally, taking several class victories in the legendary Monte Carlo, which was first held in 1911.

The ŠKODA FABIA R5, a high-tech 4x4, was homologated by the International Automobile Federation FIA on 1 April 2015. ŠKODA's new FABIA R5 is successfully continuing the long tradition of ŠKODA Motorsport. Its predecessor, the FABIA SUPER 2000, won 50 national and international titles around the world. In the FIA World Rally Championship (WRC 2) 2016, Esapekka Lappi/Janne Ferm (FIN/FIN) won the title for the Czech car maker. In total, ten of the 2016 season's races in the World Rally Championship were won by a ŠKODA FABIA R5. ŠKODA drivers Gustavo Saba (PRY) and Gaurav Gill (IND) also won the continental championships in South America and the Asia-Pacific region at the wheel of the successful ŠKODA FABIA R5. Nasser Al-Attiyah (QAT) was unbeatable in the Middle East Rally Championship (MERC), while a further ten national titles also went the way of ŠKODA drivers.

2017 was the most successful year in the history of ŠKODA Motorsport. Works duo Pontus Tidemand/Jonas Andersson (S/S) became WRC 2 Champions, ŠKODA Motorsport won the Team Championship. Jan Kopecký/Pavel Dresler (CZ/CZ) won the Czech Rally Championship (MČR) for the third time in a row and are the spearhead of in total 14 crews winning their country's national titles. Furthermore the FIA Asia-Pacific Rally Championship (APRC), the FIA South American Rally Championship (CODASUR) and the FIA African Rally Championship (ARC) have been won by teams competing in a ŠKODA FABIA R5. In 2018 Jan Kopecký/Pavel Dresler (CZ/CZ) managed to win the Czech Rally Championship (MČR) for the fourth consecutive time.
