## **Dr. Michael Oeljeklaus (\*1963)**

Dr. Michael Oeljeklaus was born on 2 November 1963 in Lengerich, Germany.

He obtained his degree in Mechanical Engineering, specializing in automation technology at the University of applied Science in Osnabrück, 1988. In the same year, he began his career as a voluntary at Volkswagen AG, where he became Deputy Director of the injection moulding in plastic parts production at the Volkswagen plant in Wolfsburg in 1990.

Between 1991 and 1993, Dr. Oeljeklaus was employed at Volkswagen Bordnetze GmbH in Berlin – firstly as the Production Manager and subsequently as Technical Procurator.

In 1993, returning to Wolfsburg, he assumed various managerial roles within the Production department. Over the following five years, he led the Cost Centre in seat production, and was responsible for the launch of both the SEAT Arosa and Volkswagen Lupo vehicle projects.

Between 1998 and 2001, Dr. Michael Oeljeklaus led the Volkswagen Coaching GmbH establishment in Kassel. In spring 2001, he once again returned to Wolfsburg, assuming responsibility for the launches of all new vehicle projects for the Volkswagen brand. Between 2002 and 2005, Dr. Michael Oeljeklaus served as the Technical Director and Management Spokesman to Volkswagen Sachsen GmbH, with overall responsibility for the Volkswagen AG subsidiary. In 2005 he obtained his degree as Diplom-Ingenieur at Chemnitz University of Technology.

In 2005 Dr. Oeljeklaus was appointed Technical Executive Director of Shanghai Volkswagen Automotive Co. Ltd. (SVW), and in this position was responsible for the product management, technical development, production planning, logistics, as well as the production at all SVW sites in China.

Dr. Michael Oeljeklaus has been the Board Member for Production and Logistics at ŠKODA AUTO a.s. in Mladá Boleslav, Czech Republic since 1 August, 2010.

In 2019, Dr. Oeljeklaus received his doctorate in the Department of Mechanical Engineering at the Technical University in Liberec.
