grip on slippery and wet roads.


How's the **BATTERY?**Winter really takes a toll on the battery, and if it's not in the best shape, just one freezing night might mean it won't start in the morning.

kids can help out scraping off
ice when you go on a trip.

WINDSCREEN

FILM is a great option. It doesn't cost or weigh much and it means you don't have to scrape off ice in the morning.




When was the last time you saw your TOW ROPE? In winter it doesn't take much for you to get stuck in a snowdrift. Having a good rope to hand is then priceless.
